# NOTICE OF INFORMATIONAL MEETINGS, PUBLIC AND EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS, AND AVAILABILITY OF DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

Issued: May 13, 2025

In the Matter of the Application of Xcel Energy for a Certificate of Need and Route Permit for the Mankato – Mississippi River 345 kV Transmission Line Project in Southeast Minnesota

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (Commission) will hold public hearings on the application of Xcel Energy for a certificate of need and a route permit for the Mankato — Mississippi River Transmission Line Project (MMRT). The proposed Project is a new approximately 130-mile 345-kilovolt (kV) transmission line between the existing Wilmarth Substation in Mankato to the Mississippi River near Kellogg, and a new approximately 20-mile 161 kV transmission line between the existing North Rochester Substation near Pine Island and an existing transmission line northeast of Rochester. The Project may cross portions of Blue Earth, Le Sueur, Waseca, Rice, Dodge, Olmsted, Goodhue, Winona, Wabasha, and Steele counties and is divided into the four segments described below (see attached Project Overview Map):

- Segment 1: a new 48 to 54-mile 345-kV transmission line between the Wilmarth Substation and a point near the West Faribault Substation;
- Segment 2: a new 34 to 42-mile 345-kV transmission line from a point near the existing West Faribault Substation to the existing North Rochester Substation;
- Segment 3: conversion of 27 miles of existing 161/345-kV transmission line to 345/345-kV operation, and installation of a new 16-mile 345-kV circuit on the existing 345/345-kV double-circuit capable structures between the existing North Rochester Substation and the Mississippi River; and
- Segment 4: a new 20 to 24-mile 161-kV transmission line between the existing North Rochester Substation and the existing 161-kV Chester Line northeast of Rochester.

The applicant has requested a route width of 1,000 feet along most of the proposed alignments (500 feet to either side of proposed centerlines), with wider areas (up to 1.25 miles wide)

around Project substations, in locations with routing constraints, and where route options come together. The 345 kV portion of this Project typically requires a permanent 150-foot-wide right-of-way. For the 161 kV portions of the Project, a 100-foot-wide right-of-way is typically required.

Xcel Energy indicated that this Project, along with other Long Range Transmission Planning (LRTP) projects that were studied and approved by the Midcontinent Independent System Operator, Inc. (MISO) are needed to provide reliable, resilient, and cost-effective delivery of energy as the generation resource mix continues to evolve from aging coal-fired generation plants to renewable energy sources. Specifically, this Project and the other LRTP projects in Wisconsin¹ are needed to address loading and congestion issues on the existing 345 kV transmission system across southern Minnesota and Wisconsin.

# **Public Hearing Information**

The public hearings will be presided over by the Honorable Ann O'Reilly, an administrative law judge from the Office of Administrative Hearings, who will provide the Commission with findings of fact, conclusions of law, and a recommendation.

The purpose of the public hearings is to obtain public input on the proposed project and the draft EIS, and compile the record for the Commission to consider in making a final decision on the certificate of need and route permit applications. Specifically, interested persons will have the opportunity to: (1) ask questions of state staff and the applicant; (2) offer oral and written comments on the merits of the proposed project and on the draft EIS; and (3) suggest possible conditions to be considered for inclusion in a route permit.

- Comments received at the hearings and during the comment period will be used to inform the record and help the Commission make its final decision.
- The information presented will be the same at all in-person and online hearings.
- The hearings will end when all attendees have had the opportunity to comment and all other business has been concluded, or the scheduled end time of the hearing, whichever occurs first. Therefore, it is important to arrive at the start of the public hearing.
- Members of the public may participate without the necessity of intervening as a party; representation by legal counsel is permitted but not required.

Written comments will be accepted through June 10, 2025, at 4:30 p.m. Please include the docket number in all communications. Comments received after the close of the comment period may or may not be considered by the Commission.

#### **Topics for Comment**

- What information needs to be clarified or included in the draft EIS to ensure that the final EIS is complete and accurate?
- Should the Commission grant a certificate of need for the proposed MMRT Project?
- Should the Commission grant a route permit for the proposed MMRT Project?
- If granted, what additional conditions or requirements should be included in a route permit?
